EXPANDING OUR SERVICES

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A Message from Medical Staff President, Katherine Austman, MD, FASAM

Gibson Area Hospital and Health Services continues to meet the needs of our patients and communities by expanding our service lines such as orthopedics, urology, neurology, addiction medicine, podiatry, hematology, oncology, pulmonology, rheumatology, interventional radiology, cardiology, psychiatry, dentistry, and ENT. As the primary physician appointed to work with our grant committee, GAHHS has received approximately 1.7 million dollars in grant funding in 2023 and we continue to search for new grants. These additional funds allow our organization continual growth and the ability to provide state-of-the-art services and support to the communities we serve.

We have maintained our 5-star patient experience as designated by CMS, being recognized by Women's Choice as a top 100 Hospital for Orthopedics and Obstetrics. Most recently GAHHS received the distinguished honor of being selected as one of only three hospitals in both the rural and urban settings in the state of Illinois. Dr. Bowman, Chief Medical Officer of Healthgrades data science department stated "Gibson Area Hospital ranked second in the state delivering consistent superior outcomes that consumers should be confident they are receiving top-ranked care."

Illinois is not immune to the national trend of "healthcare deserts." With the closure of services within Central Illinois our Emergency Department has increased volumes an average of 16% and Family Medicine Obstetrics services had a 3% increase with a projected 10% increase in deliveries throughout our eight-county service area. With last year's addition of the Medical Office Building, GAHHS remains committed to offering accessible quality healthcare and is dedicated to our mission of being "the model of excellence in community-based setting."

Of course, none of this would be possible without the continued dedication of our Physicians, Advanced Practice Providers, and exceptional staff. 2023 has been a busy year for the physicians at GAHHS. GAHHS continues to be unique in the area of provider involvement. We are fortunate to have an administration that recognizes that provider input at all levels of the organization is not only beneficial but essential to our growth and success.



WOUND CARE EXPANSION

The Gibson Area Hospital Advanced Wound Healing Clinic will be expanding and relocating in the spring of 2024! Their new location will be on the lower level of #10 Doctors Park, Gibson City.

The newly renovated and expanded space will be ready in early 2024. The Advanced Wound Healing Clinic strives to provide individualized care for patients based on evidence-based practices. In addition to healing wounds, our focus is to help our patients prevent new wounds from occurring.



The Advanced Wound Healing Clinic is an outpatient hospital-based clinic that treats non-healing chronic wounds such as:

- Pressure ulcers/Bedsores
- Venous Stasis Ulcers
- Diabetic Foot Ulcers
- Other hard-to-heal ulcers and wounds

The Clinic, led by Medical Director Dr. Joseph Chung, provides advanced wound care treatments including:

- Negative pressure wound therapy
- Multilayer compression therapy
- Cellular and/or Tissue-based products
- Total contact casting
- Epidermal Autografting
- Advanced wound dressings
- MIST Ultrasound Therapy



ADDICITON MEDICINE

Advancing the mission of educating and treating addiction medicine, Gibson Recovery Optimizing Wellness (GROW) strives to meet patients where they are and work toward the goals they set for themselves.

GROW is a physician-based clinic that includes a multi-disciplinary approach to optimizing wellness for those with substance use disorder, while still offering comprehensive family medicine.

Addiction services provided include but are not limited to, alcohol use disorder, opioid use disorder, stimulant use disorder (methamphetamine, cocaine), cannabis use disorder, nicotine use disorder, and medication for addiction treatment (MAT). We also have a substance abuse social worker available to offer a more universal approach to treatment in recovery from substance use. Another addition to the services provided is a Peer Recovery Specialist. This is a person with lived experience of substance use who is in recovery and can help others with motivation and support through their journey toward recovery.

SMART Recovery (Self-Management and Recovery Training) is offered in Gibson City, Watseka, Paxton, and Mahomet. SMART Recovery is a group that fosters self-empowering ways to overcome negative behaviors. Many team members have completed training to facilitate these meetings.

Beyond the individual seeking assistance, in 2023 meetings began in Gibson City to offer support to "Friends and Family"; all too often, these loved ones are overlooked.



SMART Recovery

Self-Management and Recovery Training (SMART) is a "community of mutual support groups" to help all those with an addiction. Sue Emberson, LPN works with Dr. Austman daily at her clinic and with addiction medicine and is a certified SMART Recovery facilitator. Sue has been instrumental in training other team members to be facilitators as well.

Opioid Coalitions

Each of the 3 coalitions is still going strong: Ford, Iroquois, and Livingston Counties. Coalitions continue to grow and work with local law enforcement, government, educators, and healthcare providers to provide information and options to serve and educate communities.



Rural Communities Opioid Response Grant

Grant funds in the amount of \$1 million have been received by GAHHS for Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome and Psychostimulant Support. These HRSA 19-082 grants will improve access to prevention, treatment, and recovery services; strengthen data collection and reporting to inform the real-time response to epidemic; advance the practice of pain management; increase the availability, distribution, and training for use of overdose reducing drugs; and provide support for better research to reduce opioid-related health harms.

NUTRITION/DIETETICS

Registered Dietitians (RD) are considered nutrition experts and play a pivotal role in the health of individuals and the community. RD's use nutrition education to aid in the management of certain diseases, promote overall health and well-being and help make sustainable changes in regards to diet and lifestyle.

In 2023, the GAHHS Dietetics department welcomed a second full-time dietitian, allowing for increased communication and education for our inpatient and long-term care, while continuing to expand outpatient services. Outpatient dietitian visits more than tripled over the course of the past year. Dietitian services have also become available at the Elite Sport and Fitness in Gibson, bridging the gap between diet and exercise.

GAHHS dietitians have also moved offices to a larger location within the main hospital. The new location provides a more welcoming and personable space, conducive to learning.

DIABETES HEALTH

GAHHS Diabetes Support Services announced its official accreditation from the Association of Diabetes Care & Education Specialists (ADCES) in June 2023.

This program plays a vital role in providing comprehensive diabetes care and education to members of our community. As a trusted resource for individuals living with diabetes, the program offers a variety of services designed to empower patients to manage their condition effectively.

Receiving accreditation from ADCES is a significant milestone for GAHHS Diabetes Support Services. This recognition validates the program's commitment to excellence and adherence to the highest standards in diabetes care and education.

Diabetes is a disease that changes over time, and with each change comes the need for new knowledge, skills, and adjustments in a person's care. Being proactive when changes occur helps keep them on track to maintaining their overall health.

GAHHS has a Certified Diabetes Care and Education Specialist (CDCES) with the experience, special knowledge, and skills to help people with diabetes successfully manage all aspects of their diabetes health. It is recommended that they see a CDCES at these key times:

- When initially diagnosed with diabetes
- At least once per year
- When struggling to meet care goals
- When new complicating factors arise
- During changes in one's life and care

Collaboration

THERAPY SERVICES COLLABORATE TO MEET THE NEEDS OF OUR COMMUNITY

This year our Therapy Services department has grown by collaborating with multiple departments within our organization to meet the increasing and changing needs of our communities. While it is natural for therapy services to work alongside the orthopedics and sports medicine departments, as well as providing acute therapies for our inpatient needs. Many patients have had to travel outside of our service range for therapy treatments that were not previously offered. As a response to this rising need, we have diversified and innovatively brought these specialties to our community in collaboration with multiple GAH departments.



Pediatric Therapy Services: We have had the opportunity to collaborate with Dr. Weger, Behavioral Wellness, as well as our referring Family Medicine providers to treat our pediatric patients in both speech and occupational therapy. This is a service line that is known for its long waitlist for these kids to get the appropriate skilled therapies. Our therapists, Emily Seneca, SPT, and Holly Roberts, OT have worked hard to get these kids the proper resources and treatments they need.





Speech Therapy co-treating with ENT: Kim Nelson-Rusch, SPT has been helping meet the needs of our speech patients by co-treating alongside Dr. Glickstein and Laura Browning, PA-C in the ENT clinic. This collaboration has allowed for quick identification of patients who would benefit from speech therapy for swallowing and voice impairments as well as a collaborative evaluation for these patients. Kim also continues to provide a free, weekly speech therapy group for patients with Parkinson's disease to help maintain their ability to communicate as

their disease progresses.



Lymphedema Therapy: We have expanded our Lymphedema Therapy offerings to both Cissna Park and now in Gibson City! Rachel Miguel, PT, and Dwayne Skidmore, PTA are our new additions to Lymphedema therapy (Shane Stachura, DPT, and Andrew Cooke, PTA located at our Cissna Park location). A female CLT is important in treating with modesty our Breast Cancer patients and other female patients with lymphatic impairment. Lymphedema therapy provides collaborating management of patients from multiple areas of medicine including our Wound clinic and Oncology.

Pelvic Floor Therapy: Brianna Stryczek, DPT, and Erin Clark, PTA have been working alongside Lauren Mansell, DPT to successfully build our Pelvic Floor therapy services. Collaborating with Family Medicine, the Dietetics department, and the OB department to treat these patient's concerns regarding bowel, bladder, and sexual health. They have started a free "Push Clinic" screen for our soon-to-be new moms, built in collaboration with the childbirth and breastfeeding classes offered at GAH.

GIBSON GETS IT

BEHAVIORAL WELLNESS

GAHHS welcomed Dr. Benjamin Weger to the Behavioral Wellness team in 2022. Dr. Weger completed subspecialty training at Vanderbilt University Medical Center to treat the full spectrum of psychiatric conditions (e.g. anxiety, mood, ADHD, etc.) in children, adolescents, and adults.

Dr. Weger has additional training and experience in patients with PTSD/complex trauma, dual diagnosis (substance use + another mental health diagnosis) first episode psychosis, psychiatric comorbidities with autoimmune disorders and infections (e.g. HIV), traumatic brain injuries, psychiatric conditions within LGBTQ+ populations, and behavioral concerns in autism and other neurodevelopmental disorders. His expertise lies in medication management, but also incorporates psychotherapeutic and wellness strategies into treatment plans.

During his medical education, he completed a separate program specifically focused on how to help patients at the intersection of their health and rural settings. Dr. Weger is excited to return to practice in the Gibson City area after previously rotating through GAHHS during his training. Dr. Weger sees patients at the Behavioral Wellness Center, located at #10 Doctors Park, Gibson City. In addition, Dr. Weger also sees patients at Gibson Health of Hoopeston, Gibson Health of Watseka, and Prairie Family Medicine & Obstetrics, in Forrest. For more information or to schedule an appointment with Dr. Weger, call 217-784-4540.

Alongside Dr. Weger, Ashlee Abitz is here to address your mental health needs as well. Ashlee completed her PMHNP degree at Lakeland College in Mattoon, IL, and has been a part of Gibson Area Hospital since 2022. Her life's passion is to destigmatize mental illnesses while making it a priority to provide easier access to mental healthcare. She has experience with inpatient youth, adolescents, and adults. Additionally, she has worked with substance abuse rehabilitation patients and has experience caring for those who undergo ECT (electroconvulsive therapy). Her main expertise is medication management, but Ashlee feels very comfortable incorporating therapy into her medication management appointments if needed. Ashlee sees patients out of the Gibson City Behavioral Wellness Center, located at #10 Doctor's Park.

CARING CONNECTIONS

Caring Connections is Gibson Area Hospital's mental health treatment program for older adults (65+). We are an Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP), which focuses mainly on group therapy services. Our dedicated team is committed to providing comprehensive and compassionate care to older adults on their journey to mental wellness.

Our program has been an important part of GAH for over 10 years, and during that time we have seen many great changes! Most recently, a new therapist joined our program – Cara Niebur, MS, LPC. Additionally, we relocated in November 2023 to 417 Hager Drive. Our team has worked hard to make this space our own, and our patients have really enjoyed the homey atmosphere!



In addition to psychiatric and therapeutic services, we work to connect our patients with appropriate services, such as nutrition and dietetics, diabetic care, and Meals on Wheels.

A challenge we see in nearly every patient that comes through our door is loneliness and isolation. Research indicates that social isolation significantly increases the risk of many mental and physical health issues, including depression, anxiety, suicidality, dementia, and obesity. To mitigate these risks, we host monthly community events for seniors! Recent activities have included a paint-like-me party, creating Halloween doormats, painting holiday signs, and Jeopardy! Trivia. We are thankful for the opportunity to offer these free events to seniors! (Check out our Caring Connections Facebook page to stay up-to-date with our events!)

If you or a loved one may benefit from our services, please do not hesitate to reach out! We are always accepting referrals, and patients who fit the criteria for our program are generally admitted within 2 weeks of the referral.



CARING CONNECTIONS CONTINUED

What has not changed is the compassionate therapy and care our patients receive. Patients have described their journey with us as "life-changing." One alumnus states, "The staff are amazing people who truly want to help and I recommend Caring Connections to anybody who is having mental health problems." We're proud to say that our patients experience incredible success with developing coping skills, managing grief, gaining self-esteem, and finding the strength to thrive in their golden years! Patients who complete our program boast a 65% reduction in depressive symptoms and a 21% decrease in anxiety symptoms. Additionally, 48% of our patients experience an increase in cognitive functioning.

Our program offers a range of services designed to address the diverse needs of older adults:

- Confidential treatment by a board-certified psychiatrist (Dr. Martin J. Repetto, Ph.D., MD, who is incredibly well-versed in the treatment of older adults), a licensed therapist (Cara Niebur, MS, LPC), and a psychiatric nurse (Amanda Justice, RN)
- Treatment coordination with the patient's primary care physician
- Lunch that is provided by the hospital
- Personalized treatment plans with goals tailored to each patient's needs





EMS GRANTS



Grants were awarded once again to the GAH Ambulance Service during the 2023 fiscal year. We received a total of \$298,000 in Grants for EMS Training and equipment purchases from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). This grant provided funding for training EMS personnel as appropriate to maintain licenses and certifications relevant to serving in an EMS agency; conducting courses that qualify graduates to serve in an EMS agency; funding specific training to meet federal or state licensing or certification requirements; ensuring EMS personnel are trained on mental and substance use disorders and care for people with such disorders in emergencies; purchase of the opioid overdose antidote Naloxone and train EMS personnel on the use in emergency opioid overdose situations.

In addition, GAH Ambulance Service was also awarded a Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) EMS Small Rural Hospital Improvement Program (SHIP) Grant in the amount of \$3,000 through the Illinois Critical Access Network (ICAHN).
